## Pantry

2023 had the food pantry staff and volunteers showing us how quickly they could adapt to change! The excitement of the summer-long construction of Cairn House meant dealing with unpredictable parking for our pantry shoppers. We dusted off our COVID curbside model and seamlessly continued operations. Now, we are operating under a hybrid model of inside shopping and curbside pickup

Our pantry provided food to 1,579 households in Dunn County, and averaged 475 kids a week in our Project SAM (weekend kids meals). Currently, we are distributing more than 550 SAM bags a week - an all-time high! Our pantry program continues to meet the needs of our communities.

2023 was a wild ride! The Shelter Staff wound up a very active motel program

just in time for the opening of Cairn House. We continue to have a long waitlist for all the shelters,

but overall, the shelters are going well. Serving food to 20 people at Cairn

House was mind-boggling at first, but the various Church Tables have been providing dinners Mon. - Thur. and volunteers have been signing up to serve food Fri. - Sun nights. The shelter itself with its individual rooms and bathrooms has been a big hit. The guests at the shelter have been a true joy – a mingling of creative and interesting folks, very respectful and helpful around the shelter. Not a single day goes by that I don't learn something new or laugh. I walked in the shelter at the crack of dawn on a very cold and gray day and told the folks



sitting there that if I didn't love them so much I wasn't sure I would have been able to get out of bed. To a one, they all turned to me and said "We love you too." How great is this job? You could get that kind of response too if you wanted to volunteer!

Through this program, we were able to help 4 at-risk families and individuals transition into stable and secure housing. For the next two years, they will remain in this program, learning the skills needed to maintain housing.

We have hit a higher number of volunteer hours this year than we ever have, and it wouldn't be done without the 200+ active volunteers are currently have!

### From the Director's Chair

It is always important to share our service numbers with you. They tell a story of

community-level need and a community-level response to meet that need. In 2023, our Pantry Program provided food to 4,888 of your neighbors. That's right, one-in-ten people in Dunn County received food through Stepping Stones and more than half of the recipients of this nutrition were seniors, or children. We also ended the year distributing meal bags through area schools to more than 500 children each week through our Share-A-Meal program.

During the same year, Cairn House was completed. Its 20 rooms, added to our five family-focused shelter apartments, means that Stepping Stones will provide approximately 12,000 shelter-nights in 2024. Twelve-thousand times, heads will hit pillows in warmth and safety. Twelve-thousand times, an individual will wake-up to a day being supported in finding stability and a better situation.

The Community Connections program has expanded, as well. In 2023, we added a homelessness prevention program, pairing case-management and direct assistance to aid those at risk of losing stable housing. Additionally, our volunteers provided 912 hours of projects and home visits to low-income seniors. This includes food deliveries and welfare check-ins, combating isolation and difficulties making ends-meet for these vulnerable individuals.

Going into 2024, Stepping Stones needs more involvement from you, your friends and your family. We need your donations to break-even as hundreds-of-thousands of dollars in government grants are no-longer available to our programs. We need you to volunteer on a regular basis, as these same programs face growing need while stalwart contributors reduce their hours due to age and health. We need you to give to your neighbors because of two things: you care and you can.

Please help us to continue our important work. More-accurately, please contribute and make the work your own.
